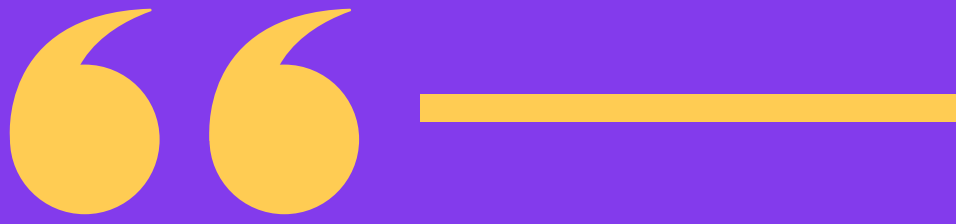


Feminist resourcing is about transforming systems
